Director's Note

On the title page of your program, you'll see that this play takes place "Fifteen years after Nora left Torvald."

Fifteen years. So where (when) does that leave us?

A Doll's House, Part 2 is a sequel (of sorts) to A Doll's House by Henrik Ibsen. Ibsen set his play in the present day, which, at the time of his writing, was 1879, so that would mean A Doll's House Part 2 takes place in 1894. Sort of.

This play exists both in and out of time. The period setting is reflected in Maureen Stevens' beautiful costumes and in Nora's struggles against the era's attendant societal and legal restraints on women. The characters' language and physicality, however, veer (sometimes wildly) into the present day. That is because Lucas Hnath's play, written in 2016, is not really a sequel. It is less interested in what happens to Nora fifteen years later than it is in the conversations we continue to have about this play more than a century later-litigating and relitigating the morality of Nora's decision to leave her husband and children. It is both about the characters in 1879 and about all of us-actors and audiencegathered tonight in 2025, as we turn these characters-and Nora's decision—over and over, looking at every consequence from every angle. Ibsen's play remains relevant because Nora's central complaint is still familiar to many. In our production, the characters from A Doll's House collide with this specific set of actors, who bring their own embodied experiences and expression to grapple with questions of commitment, power, and how we might share our lives with the people we love while maintaining our own identities.

As the dramaturg for A Doll's House, Part 2, I've had the opportunity to delve deeply into the complexities of the play's characters and themes and to explore where they exist within the world of the play. A Doll's House, Part 2 picks up where Henrik Ibsen's groundbreaking A Doll's House left off. In Ibsen's original play, Nora famously walks out on her husband, Torvald, and her children, an act that was both scandalous and liberating for the time. Hnath's sequel, set 15 years later, imagines the repercussions of Nora's departure and explores themes of freedom, identity, and the complexities of relationships.

In Part 2, Nora has become a successful writer while publishing under a pseudonym and living life to the fullest. For 15 years Nora had been living under the assumption that she was a divorced woman and as such, entered into business contracts, earned money, and had relationships with other men. However, upon the realization that she is still legally married, her world turns upside down as all of those actions are illegal for a married woman and she is forced to return home to finalize her divorce from Torvald. Nora is now a stranger to her family and herself as she returns to the home she once abandoned, setting in motion a conflict with both her past and present. A Doll's House, Part 2, invites you to reflect on the intersection of personal freedom, societal roles, and the enduring question of what it means to be truly free. Please, enjoy the show!


