Director's Note

My name is Shelby Gainsborough Bukaty, I'm a senior here at Niagara University Theatre, and I was lucky enough to be given the opportunity to direct the show you are about to see (or have already seen, depending on when you are reading this). In this process, I learned many things. I can safely say, at the moment I am writing this, that this was not easy. Leading a project rarely is, with so many people depending on me and trusting in my abilities. However, thanks to the enthusiasm, energy, skill, and flexibility of our production team and our cast, we persevered over the obstacles that faced us. This project was built from the foundations of cooperation, trust, and understanding, and from that trust we present to you Art by Yasmina Reza.

Art is a show about perspective. We as people are the byproduct of experience, a mess of ideas and concepts that we absorb from our friends, our family, the media we consume, the things we come to understand as "good" and "bad". Art, the concept, is inherently subjective, as the way we perceive the artistic media is immediately informed by our experience. My mother, who was raised on country music since her youth, would find more appreciation in a Johnny Cash album than I would. On the other side of that, I, with my immediate connection to the internet in my youth and had exposure to EDM genres as a result, would find more to appreciate in a Porter Robinson album than she would. Neither perspective is correct, nor is either perspective incorrect. This contrast that we develop naturally through our lives is what fuels this show, with the characters' perspectives on art, and each other, conflict and clash in ways that speak to the way that friendship and toxic masculinity exist in immediate adversity to each other.

This show was selected by, produced by, built by, and run by students of Niagara University and students alone. We are funded by the Niagara University Players, a student run club on campus dedicated to facilitating and advocating for theatrical education and students with an interest in theatrical study. It's an honour to represent the NU Players as the director of this production. I am one of, if not, the first transgender director of a main stage production here at Niagara University, and I hope that this inspires future trans students to be able to express their voices and empower them in this department. A hefty task for sure, but hey, it's the stuff dreams are made of. I hope you enjoy this show. I hope you are able to find some element of yourself in this show we have constructed for you. I hope that you had a safe journey here and have a safe journey home after bows have finished, and if nothing else, I hope this show makes you think.

Author Biographies



YASMINA REZA is a French playwright and novelist, based in Paris, whose works have all been multi-award-winning, critical and popular international successes, produced worldwide and translated into 35 languages. She has written seven plays (CONVERSATIONS AFTER A BURIAL, THE PASSAGE OF WINTER, "ART," THE UNEXPECTED MAN, LIFE X 3, A SPANISH PLAY, GOD OF CARNAGE, HOW YOU TALK THE GAME) and 6 novels ("Hammerklavier," "Une Desolation (Desolation)," "Adam Haberberg," "Dans la Luge d'Arthur Schopenhauer," "Nulle Part" and "L'Aube, le Soir ou la Nuit (Dawn Dusk or Night)"). Films include: "Le Pique-Nique de Lulu Kreutz," directed by Didier Martiny and "Chicas," written and directed by the author.



CHRISTOPHER HAMPTON'S plays and musicals have so far garnered four Tony Awards, three Olivier Awards, four Evening Standard Awards, and the New York Drama Critics' Circle Award: prizes for his film and television work include an Oscar, two BAFTAs. a Writers' Guild of America Award, the Prix Italia, a Special Jury Award at the Cannes Film Festival, Hollywood Screenwriter of the Year, and The Collateral Award at the Venice Film Festival for Best Literary Adaptation. Original plays: APPOMATTOX, THE TALKING CURE, WHITE CHAMELEON, TALES FROM HOLLYWOOD, TREATS. SAVAGES, THE PHILANTHROPIST, TOTAL ECLIPSE, and WHEN DID YOU LAST SEE MY MOTHER? Adaptations from novels: YOUTH WITHOUT GOD (Horváth), EMBERS (Márai), and LES LIASONS DANGEREUSES (Laclos), Musicals: STEPHEN WARD, DRACULA: THE MUSICAL, and SUNSET BOULEVARD, Libretti: APPTOMATTOX, THE TRIAL, and WAITING FOR THE BARBARIANS (all for Philip Glass). Translations include plays by Chekhov, Ibsen, Molière, Horváth, Yasmina Reza, and Florian Zeller, Film includes: "Ali and Nino," "A Dangerous Method," "Chéri," "Atonement," "The Quiet American," "Dangerous Liaisons," "The Good Father," "The Honorary Consul," "Total Eclipse," "Mary Reilly," "Tales From The Vienna Woods," and "A Doll's House." He wrote and directed "Imagining Argentina," "The Secret Agent," and "Carrington," Television includes: "The Thirteenth Tale," "The Ginger Tree," "Hôtel Du Lac," "The History Man," and "Able's Will."
