

Director's Note

'The way I flew! Do you know, Jane, I sometimes wonder whether I ever did really fly.'

'Yes, you did.'

'The dear old days when I could fly!'

'Why can't you fly now, mother?'

'Because I am grown up, dearest. When people grow up they forget the way.'

-Peter and Wendy; or, Peter Pan, The Boy Who Wouldn't Grow Up by J.M. Barrie



Peter and Wendy, first produced and published as a play in 1904, and then as a novel in 1911, imagines a world where a boy who lives in a world of perpetual youth and magnificent adventure gallantly (selfishly?) invites a girl and her brothers into his world, lured by the prospect of family that he hasn't got in Neverland. Eventually, Peter and Wendy return to their proper worlds, transformed by their meeting, but not enough to commit to the other's life.

Peter & The Starcatcher, first created as a novel by Dave Barry and Ridley Pearson, then as a play by Rick Elice, reimagines Peter's origin. Gloriously funny, and touching, its focus- as in the original- is finding one's place in the world; about balancing self-discovery with the preservation of imagination and play. It asks us to reflect upon what we gain by growing into adulthood and what we lose by leaving childhood behind. Where, and with whom, do we belong? And, for all of us, isn't that just the practice of being human? A flight that begins with youth and continues as we change and grow.

As actors, we're continually engaged in a process of rediscovering the freedom of childhood, of spontaneity, of flying off into grand tales of imagination that are so easy to access when we're young and have the faith that we won't fall. And here's the thing about acting. In order to do it well, I mean really well, one has to free oneself- a bit, anyway- of the constraints of maturity. To allow for, and invite, transformation. And Peter and The Starcatcher illustrates that transformative power, both in the journeys of its characters, but also in the theatrical techniques we use to transform the world of the play we share with you.

The colleagues with whom I'm privileged to work- actors, choreographers, musicians, designers, stage management, technical crew- have courageously flown, remembering the way, and reminded me that it's joyous to fly alongside them. We're pleased to have you here to join us in flight.




