In writing and creating Re-Envisioning Joan

My chief objectives in creating Re-Envisioning Joan included empowering student voices, outlining various viewpoints of Joan of Arc through aerials, and investigating the relevancy of Joan's story in 1431 to the life our students face now. In this piece, George Bernard Shaw's viewpoint as a feminist, critic, anti-war activist, and playwright of his time served as a launch pad, as well as the actual transcript of Joan's trial, but what kept on revealing itself in this process for me was the theme of voices. What voices did Joan hear, and what are we hearing now? How did those voices guide her to act and what voices cause us to act now? Are they the truth? Are they propaganda? As Joan was on trial then, our students face a new America where science, democracy, social programs, voting rights, women and LGBTQ rights and race are changing viewpoints. As a cast, we hope to encourage the following questions: What voices are you listening to and why? What are you consuming? What is dictatorship and what is democracy? What is nationalism? And, like Joan, what are the things that need to be confessed before we can move on with God, planet, humanity, and leadership?

I have worked with a magnificent cast. They have tackled the emotional, physical, and creative process of this piece in every moment of rehearsal and they have claimed ownership of what they are hearing and acting upon. I am so enormously proud of them as performers and people. I hope they are as inspirational for you as they have been for me. We burn for you.


